Eligibility

Applications will be accepted beginning April 9, 2025, and close Friday, May 30, 2025 at 11:59 PM CST.

We encourage applications from all creative workers, regardless of the applicant's background, focus, or specialty. This program is open to artists and creatives of all disciplines, including but not limited to: visual arts, performing arts, literary arts, media arts, musical arts, and multidisciplinary arts. Given the legacy of M.T.'s life and work, special consideration and preference will be given to self-taught artists, educators, military veterans, and first responders. Artists that work in metal and restoration will be given priority due to the environment and materials available at the residency. Applicants are expected to:

- be 18 years of age or older at the time of the residency
- have an interest in working in a rural context and community
- show willingness to work with community members from a diverse range of social, cultural, economic, and political backgrounds
- have an ability to work independently in a remote location
- have a personal vehicle, driver's license, and qualifying auto insurance (due to location and lack of access to public transportation)

Due to the nature of the remote outdoor environment and insurance liabilities, we cannot accommodate children or pets at this residency program. The residency lodging is located on a second floor that is only accessible by staircase at this time. Please reach out if you would like to discuss clarification or exception.
